## **Opening Questions:**

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 10:1-13. The Apostle Paul used the history of Israel as a warning for believers in his day. Pastor Paul interpreted this against the idea of the Holy Spirit causing us to obey God. Do you agree or disagree, and why?
- 2. **Read Romans 7:14-25**: In this famous passage from the Apostle Paul, he describes his dilemma of wanting to obey but often failing to do so. How does this passage support or contradict the points made in today's sermon?
- 3. **Read Romans 8:1-15:** In light of the sermon, how does this passage strike you? How do you see the Trinity in this passage?
