Spiritual Growth Questions for April 26, 2020

(take one question each day and grow deeper in Bible study)

Opener: What is the difference between the person of Christ and the work of Christ? Why would it be important to start evangelistic conversations about the person of Christ and then His work?

- Read Hebrews 1:4, Matthew 1:21, Philippians 2:9-11, Acts 3:6,
 4:12. After reading these passages: Why is Jesus' name superior to all other names? According to these passages: Who is this Christ according to the Scriptures?
- 2. **Read Hebrews 1:5-14.** Work together and list the seven familiar contrasts between Christ and the angels in verses 5-14. The writer quotes verses from the Writings, the Prophets and the Law. Why would he do that? How do these quotations present Jesus?
- 3. **Read Hebrews 1:8-13**, **Revelation 5:11-14**. How is Christ's throne going to last forever? Why was the cross confusing to the disciples regarding God's kingdom lasting forever?
- 4. Read Hebrews 1:7, 14. Then read Judges 13:20, Matthew 4:11, Luke 22:43, I Peter 1:12. Write down what you see the angels doing? How do you see them serving Christ and His people?
- 5. What are some of the ways angels are presented in our culture? What differences do you see from this description in Hebrews? What are you learning about the worship of angels?
- 6. Read Galatians 1:8-9, 2 Corinthians 11:3-4, Revelation 22:8-9. What are Paul and John teaching about angels and errant teaching? Discuss any current examples of this in our times?
- 7. **After reading Hebrews chapter 1**. Is it possible to believe in God without believing in Christ as the only way? Discuss theologically why this is impossible?
- 8. Work together with another person to answer these **three** questions: Who is Jesus Christ? What has He done? What is the significance for us?
- 9. What are some things you consider supreme? How does the reality of Christ's superiority over all things change the way you view those things? How does Christ's supremacy affect the way you live your life day to day?

The book of Hebrews presents the greatness of Christ like no other New Testament writing. The author knew that by remembering and lifting up Jesus, he would help the readers endure their difficult circumstances. As this book is read, it demands a response. Let's take advantage of this time to listen to Him and pray this study will help us grow and be Better with Jesus!

The Old testament passages quoted here are taken from one of the major divisions of the Hebrew Scriptures: Psalm 2:7 from the Writings, 2 Samuel 7:14 from the Prophets, and Deuteronomy 32:43 from the Law. Mohler
