- 1. How often do you joyfully acknowledge God's goodness in your life? Identify one good thing God has given to you or done for you in the past week. Take a moment to celebrate it with someone else.
- 2. Read Luke 2:19-10, John 15:9-11, John 16:22-24 & 17:13. What do you see as Jesus' desire for his followers concerning joy? What is the connection between joy and sorrow? How would you advise someone to ask for joy and walk in joy?
- 3. **Read Psalm 16:11, 66:18, Isaiah 59:2, 2 Cor. 5:16.** Christian joy is essentially the enjoyment of communion with God. In view of this, what do Ps. 66:18, Is. 59:2, 2 Cor.5:16 suggest concerning a common hindrance to joy? What then should be one of the first things we do when we are not experiencing the joy of the Lord?
- 4. **Read James 1:2-4, Romans 5:3-5** gives us God's perspective regarding trials of our faith that He either allows or sends into our lives. What is this perspective? How could we maintain joy in the midst of trials?
- 5. What is impeding your ability to choose a lifestyle of joy? How can you overcome this obstacle? What action step can you take this week to increase the presence of joy in your daily life?

For further study: Read Romans 5:2, 2 Corinthians 4:16-18, Hebrews 10:34, I Peter 1:6. Taking the long-range view of life helps us increase our joy. Study the following passages of Scripture, and then describe what it means to take the long-range view.

Priorities of Advent The Priority of Joy: Walking in the Joy of Jesus Selected Scriptures December 11, 2022 Pastor John Lloyd

The holidays add even more weight to all that we may be experiencing. Advent is a time to purposefully slow down and let our hearts appreciate and enjoy time with our Lord Jesus Christ. It's a time to both remember Jesus first coming but also to welcome His presence into our lives right now. We will purpose to reflect on Jesus and what the impact of his first advent. We will also look forward to what His presence means to us going forward both in this life and the next. We desire to make advent a priority this holiday season. Today, we will focus on the advent priority of joy. If we have Jesus, we can have joy. If we have His joy, may we share it with others!

Luke 2:9 And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. 10 And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people

John 15:9 As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. 10 ^{If} you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. 11 These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

John 16:22 So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. 23 In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. 24 Until now you have asked nothing in my name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full. John 17:13 But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves.

G.K. Chesterton called this the gigantic secret of the Christian. The joy of Jesus in us.

Big Idea: If we have Jesus, we can walk in joy! May we share the joy of Jesus this advent season! Joy defined-

Isaiah 53:6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Romans 6:6 We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 13 For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

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Luke 2:11 For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

Romans 10:9 because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. (I Tim.6:12 Paul calls it the good confession)

Two ways of living: You are either confessing that you were created by God to be dependent upon his wisdom, power and grace or you are believing that you have within yourself everything you need to live well on your own. Paul Tripp

Psalm 16:11 You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore. Ps. 16:8-9

Galatians 5:22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, **joy**, peace, patience, kindness, John 17:13 But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves.

John 15:11These things I have spoken to you, **that my joy may be in you**, and that your joy may be full. 16:22 So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and **no one will take your joy from you**.

John 17:13 But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they **may have my joy fulfilled in themselves**. Jesus' prayer for us!
